Chronic liver disease encompasses a variety of causes of chronic liver injury, including nonalcoholic fatty liver disease, hepatitis C, hepatitis B, alcohol-related liver disease, primary sclerosing cholangitis, autoimmune hepatitis, and others These diseases can progress to hepatic fibrosis and cirrhosis, with associated complications of portal

Chapter 26: Liver and Gallbladder Disease in Diabetes

This chapter focuses on the relationships of three common chronic liver diseases—nonalcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD), viral hepatitis, and cirrhosis—and of gallstone disease with diabetes. NAFLD requires finding fat (steatosis) in the liver in the absence of heavy alcohol consumption and other secondary causes of hepatic steatosis.

Quality of Care Assessment in Chronic Liver Disease

Chronic liver disease is a common condition, with cirrhosis of the liver accounting for nearly 60,000 deaths in the United States each year.³ Chronic liver disease is the 12th leading cause of death in the United States (3rd or 4th leading cause of death among persons aged 45-64 years).^{3,4} Among all ...

Cirrhosis is caused by chronic (long-term) liver diseases that damage liver tissue It can take many years for liver damage to lead to cirrhosis Chronic Viral Hepatitis Viral hepatitis causes the liver to swell, which over time can lead to cirrhosis Chronic hepatitis C is the leading cause of cirrhosis in the United States About

Indeed, chronic liver disease in the United States ranks as fifth and sixth among all-cause mortality of women in this age group (2009 CDC report) 1 Infertility may be overestimated With current advances in assisted reproduction techniques, as well as aggressive medical treatment of liver diseases, fertility in this population is maintained
