Oct 01, 2018 · Safe Practice of Medication Administration •Order, MAR and medication label MUST match •Medication, dose, route, time, (texture and position if indicated) must be ordered by the practitioner and be transcribed to the MAR •Medication must remain in original container •Meds must be identifiable up to the point of administration
