Poverty in the European Union

poverty, the European Union uses a multidimensional indicator - the 'at risk of poverty or social exclusion' rate - based on three different dimensions: monetary poverty, severe material deprivation, or 'very low work intensity' Since 2008, the number of people 'at risk of poverty or social exclusion' has increased in most Member States
