The Science of Pressure Ulcer Development, Prevention and ...

Pressure ulcers are a significant problem across all healthcare settings in the United States Annually, 25 million patients are treated in acute-care facilities for pressure ulcers (5) Patients with pressure ulcers are three times more likely to be discharged to a long-term care facility than those who do not have pressure ulcers (5)

Pressure ulcers can be very costly as much as \$37,800 (Lyder & Ayello, 2008) Overall, the cost of 98,000 deaths per year is estimated to cost the US as much as 98 million dollars in quality of life years (Andel et al, 2012) That is a staggering number, but can human life be measured in monetary terms?

In Oklahoma, pressure ulcers (bed sores decubitis) impact thousands of lives across all health care settings Pressure ulcers cause pain and suffering, are expensive to treat and can be life-threatening The elderly, immobile and chronically ill are at risk The incidence of pressure ulcers can be minimized with proper prevention practices
