The PSA test is a blood test that measures the amount of prostate specific antigen (PSA) in your blood PSA is a protein produced by normal cells in the prostate and also by prostate cancer cells It's normal to have a small amount of PSA in your blood, and the amount rises as you get older and your prostate ...

Higher total PSA levels and lower percentages of free PSA are associated with higher risks of prostate cancer Most prostate cancers are slow growing, so the utility of prostate cancer screening is marginal in most men with a life expectancy of less than 10 years Interpretation When total prostate-specific antigen (PSA...)

Prostate cancer testing A PSA blood test and rectal exam can tell your doctor about your prostate Your doctor might do a PSA blood test alone, or he might do both tests What is a PSA test? This test measures how much PSA is in your blood PSA stands for prostate-specific antigen ...

To Test or Not To Test for Prostate Cancer

One use of the PSA test is to screen for prostate cancer Screening means to look for cancer early, before you see any signs of illness If prostate cancer has spread outside the prostate by the time it is found, treatment is less likely to cure the cancer The PSA test may let doctors find the cancer ...

5 Men age greater than or equal to 60 years with serum PSA less than 10 ng/mL have a very low risk of metastases or death due to prostate cancer and may not benefit from further testing A PSA cut point ...
