RUNNING RECORD OBSERVATION

A running record is a detailed, objective, sequential recording written while the event is happening It is generally short, often only 10 minutes or less The observer writes down everything possible that the child says and does during a specified length of time or during a designated activity Record all observed behavior, in great detail

of Running Records Marie Clay made a lasting contri-bution to early literacy teaching by developing the running record — an easy to use, standard coding system for capturing what young readers say and do while reading texts Running records are often taken to assess the text difficulty for the child and may be taken at different time intervals

running record will be written in the present tense, eg Claire holds onto the string with one hand A specimen record is similar to a running record but focuses on one area of development For example if you were observing language development - you would record a bit of the context, but the focus would be on the conversation

Although you can use a blank piece of paper to administer a running record, it is helpful to use a blank Running Record Recording Sheet to help with organization 1 Fill in the basic information on the top of the form Include the number of running words, the level of the text and whether the book is seen (familiar) or unseen (unfamiliar) 2

session, or even a whole day A record lasting for a predetermined length of time (eg 30 seconds or 1 minute) is made at regular intervals (eg every 10 minutes or every hour) about what a particular child (or group of children) is doing It is a useful technique for:!
Observing a child's total behaviour and to find out what a child does

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Anecdotal Records (Observations)

Examples: Child's Name: Melissa C Date & Time: 4/23/11 9:15am Place or Learning Center: Preschool Classroom self-selection Melissa sat next to a child at the reading table The child greeted Melissa with "Hi, Melissa! Wanna read a book with me?" Melissa said that she couldn't read The child replied, "We can look at the pictures"

How to record your observation: Directions • Observations must occur in a licensed preschool center-based program Licensed children's centers are programs that operate either preschool and/or full-day

Guidelines for Observing Young Children in School

A running record includes the major actions and verbalizations of the child or children, described in relation to the context, and within a time framework The time of observation, setting and passage of time should be clearly indicated Doing complete running records is difficult and requires experience It is a good idea to begin

Running Record A running record is a written description of the child's behaviour The observer records exactly what a child says and does in sequence as he/she watches This method of observation enables educators to record more detail, to describe more accurately, to avoid assumptions,

A running record is a literacy assessment technique that is formative, ie, it provides information that can be used to improve students' Reading When the teacher administers a running record the student sits or stands beside the teacher so that both can see the text As the
