o Native populations generally shared land and goods, had less defined gender roles, and spiritual religions o European populations had private land ownership and a desire to build individual wealth, more defined gender roles, and Christian religion • Conflict: Native Americans began to resist European encroachment (Pueblo Revolt 1680)
